


Latitude


-Lines of latitude run in an east-west direction across the Earth.


Longitude

-Lines of longitude run in a northsouth direction.

Although lines of longitude and latitude are only imaginary, they exist on maps and atlases to help to show us where different places are.







## Longitude

-Lines of lonaitude run between the North and South Poles. These lines are called meridians. -Like latitude, lonaitude is measured in degrees. The Greenwich (or Prime) Meridian is at 0°C -Anything east of the Greenwich Meridian is in the eastern hemisphere and is labelled °E. Anything west of the Greenwich Meridian is in the western hemisphere and is labelled °W.

- -Lines of latitude run in an east-west direction all of the way around the Earth. -Latitude is measured in degrees. The Equator is located at 0°.
  - -The Equator is an imaginary line of latitude which circles the Earth. It lies halfway between the North/ South Poles. -It splits Earth into the Northern/Southern Hemispheres. The distance around the Equator is about 24,900 miles.
  - -The Tropic of Cancer is an imaginary line of latitude which circles the Earth. It lies at 23 degrees north (23°N). -It is the latitude where the Sun is overhead on June solstice (middle of summer in the northern hemisphere).
  - -The Tropic of Capricorn is an imaginary line of latitude -It is the latitude where the Sun is overhead on December solstice (middle of summer in the southern hemisphere).
  - -The Northern Hemisphere is the section of the Earth that is north of the Equator.
    - -Countries include the UK, USA, and Russia.
  - -The Southern Hemisphere is the section of the Earth that is south of the Equator.
  - -Countries include Brazil, Australia, and New Zealand.
  - -The Arctic Circle is the area north of an imaginary line of latitude situated at around 66°N.
    - -In the Antarctic Circle, all places have 24 hours of daylight during the December solstice.
