Sport

We are proud of our PE curriculum - every pupil at Newcroft engages in 2 hours of exciting PE each week. Pupils at Newcroft experience traditional sports such as football and gymnastics, alongside sports such as yoga and boccia. The school is committed to as many pupils as possible engaging in competitive sports and as a result, we enter a range of leagues catering for all abilities and expertise. This is complimented by our extra curricular sports on offer such as judo, karate and fencing.

Forest School

Our Forest School program, expertly led by Little Acorns Forest School is located in our on-site woodland. Pre School to Year 6 are given opportunity to engage in outdoor learning, develop a love for nature and build essential life skills in a fun, hands-on environment. Forest School encourages exploration, creativity and problem-solving through outdoor play, while also fostering elements such as teamwork and resilience.











What Makes Us Unique

Music

Music at Newcroft takes high priority. We are lucky to have a newly furnished and renovated specialist music room. We are proud of our whole class instrument tuition. Our Year 3 classes enjoy learning the ocarina and in Year 4, pupils learn to play the ukulele. The music curriculum is exceptional and inspires large number of pupils to engage in 1:1 or small group peripatetic lessons with specialist music teachers. These lessons range from singing and choir, to band, drumming and guitar. Twelve different teachers visit us every week!

Cooking

We are very lucky to have a newly renovated pupil kitchen at Newcroft where pupils can learn how to prepare food safety with increasing complexity throughout their time at Newcroft. Younger pupils learn where food comes from, how to chop and prepare food carefully and hygienically. Our older pupils become master chefs, engaging in recipe adaptations, more complex food preparation and cooking using the hobs, ovens and microwaves.

Residentials

Our pupils benefit from experiencing a wide range of trips outside of school and specialist workshops in school to help bring classroom learning to life. In Year 2, pupils experience their first school residential with a 'sleepover' in the school hall. In Year 4, pupils experience outdoor activities and team building at PGL Caythorpe and in Year 6, pupils are very lucky to be able to visit London as their final primary school residential.

Year 6

Year 6 is a very special year at Newcroft. Pupils lead fundraising projects towards their end of year London residential, leavers events, leavers hoodie fund and their end of year treats. Staff and the wider community give Year 6 pupils a much deserved send off at the end of the year with carefully planned and memory making leavers events.

Our Wrap around Care

We are fortunate to have school wrap around care, managed by our support staff team, operating in term time. Games, play and fun are on offer every school day in a nurturing environment. Children benefit from 'growing up' and working with the wrap around team every day.

Wrap around care is available from Pre School to Year 6. We have unlimited places and should be booked 24 hours in advance.

Breakfast Club:

7:30-8:40am, including breakfast.

After School Club:

3:15-5:30pm, including a light snack tea.

After School Clubs

We have exceptional extra-curricular clubs. Pupils are able to engage in 35-40 clubs each half term, before school, during the school day and after school. Over 90% of these clubs are free of charge to parents. The clubs on offer are based on pupil interests: from Minecraft to gardening, dodgeball to a Harry Potter Club. Our Commitment to You

We have an extensive record of working in partnership with parents and carers to help their children achieve their very best academically and socially. We extend this support and nurture to parents and carers who need extra help or support. Our doors are always open at Newcroft as a key service in the community.

Communication:

We use a simple online app, WEDUC, which allows parents to contact the office, make payments and message teachers and senior leaders direct from their phones. The app also allows parents to keep up to date with letters, other communication and the school calendar. We are proud to be a paperless school in communication with parents.

All children have a home school diary to help teachers and support staff communicate day to day messages with parents and carers. For information about learning and special school events, we send an online half termly newsletter to parents and the community.

Pupil Progress:

- * two formal parents evening per year for all pupils.
- ★ One additional parents evening per year for pupils with send, with a focus on progress.
- ★ Mid-year report and end-of-year summative report sent to parents.









Our Curriculum

We offer a broad, creative, inclusive curriculum, with pupils gaining new knowledge and skills throughout their school journey.

Foundation

Our dedicated Foundation team are highly skilled Early Years Practitioners. We offer:

- ★ **NEW:** Weekly forest school learning, led by staff, on top of our regular Forest School sessions.
- ★ Play-based curriculum promoting love of learning, independence, resilience and fun.
- ★ Preparation for more formal learning in Year One and beyond.
- ★ Foundation Stage building with two classes and themed learning zones.
- ★ Outdoor learning environment open all year round.
- ★ Emphasis on messy, creative and large-scale play.
- * Access to extensive grounds, woodland and play equipment.

Phonics & Reading

Reading is central to our curriculum. Early reading and cultivating a love for reading are crucial at our school.

- ★ Phonics is taught daily in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 using Success for all Phonics.
- ★ Our phonics sessions are fun and interactive.
- ★ We continue teaching phonics in Year 3 and beyond for specific children as needed.
- ★ We utilise whole class reading sessions to develop comprehension as pupils move through school.





Celebrating Success

We believe in rewarding the success of our pupils. We have a simple behaviour system with expectations of good behavior, respect for others and adults, and giving their all to learning.

- ★ Consistent approach using Rainbow Rules.
- ★ Positive behaviour rewarded through Dojo Points System that accumulate towards individual awards and house group totals.
- ★ Dojo Points Biannual awards assemblies to celebrate student achievements.
- ★ Presentation of trophies and medals to recognize pupils' hard work and accomplishments.

SENDco

We are very lucky to have an experienced SENCo and Assistant SENCo (New for Autumn!), who support pupils with SEND to achieve their very best in their time at Newcroft. This is achieved through extensive partnership working with their teachers, parents and wider services. Our school is extremely inclusive and we have the approach of 'every child can.'

ELSA

Mental health and wellbeing is a high priority at Newcroft. We are proud to have a consistent tiered approach to offering pupils and parents support. We have two members of staff who hold the 'Emotional Learning Support Assistant' qualification and who see children for ELSA and counselling work during the academic day. We also have a family outreach worker who can give support to parents in addition to that on offer from our pastoral team.
